
Will voters approve a plan to *kill* your retirement security?

With promotion from the Koch Brothers, these men plan to ask voters in 2018 to approve:

The elimination of vested constitutional rights by repealing the "California Rule." The California Rule provides that retirement benefits promised to current employees cannot be impaired.

The elimination of retirement security for all new public employees, restricting them to either 401k-style plans, or nothing at all unless voters approve a benefits package.

The requiring of voter approval of any increase in pensions for existing government employees.

The banning of employer contributions over 50% of the cost - unless voters expressly approve a higher contribution.

They tried to do this in 2016, but **decided to wait for national** "right to work" instead, the Los Angeles Times reports:

"If justices decide to strike down [fair share] fees, it could deal a major blow to labor unions... 'If labor unions aren't allowed to spend unlimited amounts of money, <u>that certainly</u> <u>heightens the chances of [pension] reform</u>,' DeMaio said."
