### HOW AFFORDABLE HEALTHCARE WAS WON

San Bernardino County Teamsters Vote YES Overwhelmingly to Approve Strong New Contract

An overwhelming majority of Teamsters voted YES to ratify a new four-year contract with the County of San Bernardino. After nearly a year of bargaining, Local 1932 was able to secure a strong contract with significant increases in take-home pay for County workers. The increases in take-home pay are based on fair across-the-board raises, substantial improvements to employer contributions in health insurance premiums. and merit advancement reform that will help members progress through steps in half as much time as before. The contract covers 11,000 members.

"We are finally getting the raises we deserve to feed and support families, to put gasoline in our cars, to stay committed to the jobs we love here at home," says Yesenia Olague, a 15-year employee of the County's Workforce Development Board. The centerpiece of the new contract is an overhaul of the long-broken system for employer-provided health insurance managed by the County. Local 1932 will now be able to establish an independent trust fund for members-only that will be able to bargain with insurance carriers for quality plans and lower prices, like the County was never able to do before. Additionally, the trust fund will finally allow Teamsters the opportunity for pre-Medicare retiree health care coverage.

Over 7,000 Teamsters returned bargaining surveys during the summer of 2017. The top concerns were declining take-home pay to the skyrocketing costs of health insurance plans offered by the County. Many members were outspoken about their struggles. "I do what I can for the public, I do what I can for my children, and I do what I can for my family, but I can't seem to dig out of the hole," said Shellie Swanston, an 11 year employee at the County Workforce Development Agency in one member profile released in June. "I cannot make ends meet. To have even that \$750 that they take out of my check for medical insurance would make a huge difference for my family."

Not long after the creation of Teamsters Local 1932 in April 2015, the union began exploring the driving factors behind the County's role in high-cost healthcare with nationally recognized experts and brought solutions to the negotiating table come the first bargaining session on November 2018. After the bargaining team were able to settle upwards of 80 contract adjustments that will make life at work better, beginning in Summer 2019, the union was able to

move on towards resolving economic issues.

Teamsters across the County were called to action so that our proposed solutions would be heard and taken seriously at the table. Over 300 Teamsters gathered at the June 11th Board of Supervisors meeting to send a message: "Enough is enough. County workers need affordable healthcare now!" These Teamsters rallied right outside the Board's temporary chambers, creating a crowded visual for all of those that were inside.

On June 22nd, Local 1932 held a bargaining update rally at the Ontario Convention Center, where Local 1932 Secretary-Treasurer Randy Korgan and President Kathleen Brennan outlined the Teamster solutions to the declining take-home pay caused by unaffordable health insurance offered by the County. "We've essentially rewritten the contract from front to back, and it's not done. We still got more on the table... In our opinion there won't be a ratification meeting until there is a solution to your unaffordable health care," Korgan said at the June 22nd rally.

Joined by experts in the matter, Local 1932 explained that an independent trust fund would bring the member power necessary to lower healthcare costs for County workers, as trust funds do for millions of Teamsters across the country. Korgan told the crowd of thousands, "You've been Teamsters for four years now, and it's been a Teamster staple for more than a hundred years that we prioritize healthcare. We will take every action we can to force the employer to prioritize that subject for you too."

In the ensuing months, members participated in further actions, with lunchtime worksite-wide walkouts occurring at several County offices. Additionally, Local 1932 worked hard to connect the County to regional elected officials who were standing with us, members of the California legislature and Congressmember Pete Aguilar. In her letter, State Senator Connie Leyva wrote, "By [implementing Teamster solutions on healthcare], County leaders will help to protect our local economy and improve the quality of life for thousands of working families throughout the region."

These actions built momentum and resulted in success. Finally, in the early hours of August 22nd, Local 1932 and the County were able to come to a full tentative agreement. In the end, Local 1932 was able to announce no take-aways and at least 20% increases in total take-home pay for a majority of Teamsters, and many contract improvements. On September 9th, Local 1932 ratified the contract after a vote by the membership. The Board of Supervisors approved the agreement the next morning. Member power — Teamster power won affordable healthcare, a pathway to retiree medical coverage, and a better life at work for County workers.

"I am very excited about this contract," says Glin Stone, a 23 year County Sherriff's Department employee. "This is by far the best contract I have seen in all of my years with the County."

### MEMBER POWER GETS THE GOODS!

During the Summer of 2019, Teamsters Local 1932 members working in several cities across the region were able to secure strong contracts that brought improvements in compensation and working conditions. These victories were only possible through active member involvement and unity as Teamsters.

#### TEAMSTER COALITION FOR GOOD JOBS & CLEAN AIR AT SAN BERNARDINO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT IN ACTION AT AUGUST FAA HEARING

Hundreds of Teamsters and community members rallied to the August 8th Federal Aviation Administration hearing on the proposed Eastgate development at San Bernardino International Airport. Community members now await the FAA's decision on the project.

Local 1932, residents, and a coalition of community organizations demand that SB Airport Communities see guarantees on job quality and high-level air quality impact mitigation.

The developer of the project, Hillwood, has the exclusive rights to 14,000 acres of former Norton Air Force Base land. So far, they've developed nothing that can guarantee good wages for working families. With Amazon being the rumored tenant of Eastgate, now is the time to organize for better jobs and a roadmap to cleaner air in communities with some of the dirtiest air in the country.
